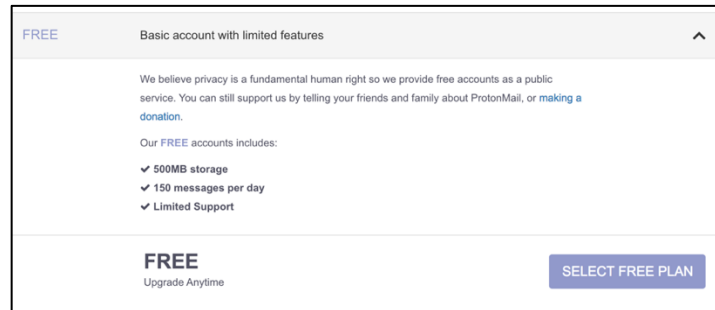


ProtonMail Access Information


ProtonMail is a free, end-to-end encrypted email service that Human Rights First uses to transfer documents securely, and to ensure confidentiality. We ask that all sensitive documents, including any Global Magnitsky case summaries or supporting documentation that the user would like to keep confidential, be sent to our ProtonMail mail account (listed below) from a ProtonMail account. Steps for creating a free account are listed below.
